

The Clark County Department of Aviation is working closely with public health officials at the Southern Nevada Health District (SNHD) and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to monitor the status of COVID-19 in our region and support a coordinated response.

Our custodial teams are deploying hospital-grade disinfectant on all high-touch surfaces around the airport, such as door handles, stair railings, luggage carts etc. This is not a new precaution — North Las Vegas Airport makes these extra efforts to sanitize every flu season.

With the emergence of the coronavirus in Clark County, we have increased the frequency of application and expanded the areas of the airport that are covered. The disinfectant in use is recommended by the CDC to combat COVID-19 and is being applied in the highest concentration for maximum impact.

We recommend that travelers follow the guidelines put out by the CDC:

- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after going to the bathroom; before eating; and after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth.
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick. Stay home when you are sick.

At this time, the CDC is not conducting coronavirus screening or related activity at Clark County airports. If and when the CDC decides action is needed, we will readily accommodate and partner with the agency to allow public health experts to conduct the activity they deem necessary.

While the COVID-19 outbreak is a serious public health threat, the SNHD maintains that the immediate risk from the virus to the general public in Clark County and the United States remains low.

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
